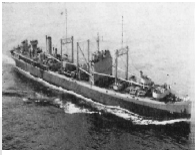

**Nitro Association Reunion
Headquarters! !** 

We have finalized arrangements with the Embassy Suites hotel in Deerfield, IL., to serve as our headquarters for the 2000 reunion. A block of 35 rooms has been reserved for our members. The cost of the rooms is \$84 per night for a King Suite and \$99 per night for a Double bed Suite. Rooms should be reserved by the individual member attending the reunion. You may make your reservations through either the Embassy Suites "toll free" number 1-800-EMBASSY or directly with the hotel at 847-945-4500. **Tell the reservation clerk that you are reserving rooms for the Nitro Reunion for "x" number of nights.** These room rates will be held for our members until June 1. **Don't wait to place your reservation till the last minute.** You may reserve a room by credit card and it will not be charged until you check out.

This facility was chosen because of the amenities (indoor heated pool, whirlpool and sauna; exercise room; tropical atmosphere, etc), its proximity to Great Lakes (for our visit on Friday, 23 June), other local attractions and transportation to the City. Each room is a two room (master bed room and living room) suite complete with wet bar and microwave, two televisions and sofa bed in living room for additional sleeping capacity. There is a complimentary breakfast each morning and a manager's reception (choice of beverage and munchies) each evening. We are planning on having a buffet dinner at the Embassy Suites on Friday evening.

Tentatively the Nitro Association business meeting will be on Thursday evening, graduation at Great Lakes Boot camp and wreath laying ceremony on Friday. The buffet dinner will be Friday night and an activity during the day on Saturday and a farewell get-together Saturday evening.
