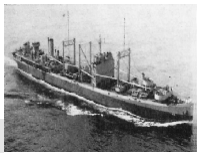

Sorry for the delay in publishing this copy of the *Nitro Blast*. After making an unscheduled trip to Charleston to make arrangements for the reunion, we have decided on the Holiday Inn, Mt. Pleasant, SC., as our reunion hotel.

A block of 30 rooms has been reserved for our members. The cost is \$99/per night for either double bed or king guest rooms (breakfast for two included).  **NWS Earle to Continue Operations** 

The following are excerpts from the Asbury Park Press, NJ), 11/18/00, courtesy of Jim Musumeci, Jr.

Despite a proposal to relocate two of the four supply ships stationed at the Earle Naval Weapons Station, the Navy says the future of the base is secure.

Two proposals are under discussion. One would move the USS Detroit and USS Seattle to another home port. The second would be to staff the two remaining combat supply ships, the USS Arctic and USS Supply, with civilians instead of military personnel.

The base employs 2,575 military and 547 civilians and has a payroll of about \$30 million. According to Pallone, the four ships at Earle are among eight Navy supply ships that have not been shifted to civilian staffs.

Powers said, but ultimately, a decision that could seriously impact Monmouth County's economy will rest with the federal government. While the Navy has assured Holt and Pallone that the future of Earle is secure, three other ships from the Navy station have been transferred away from the base and staffed with civilian crews.

Pallone and Holt sent a letter to SecNav asking him to kill the proposal to transfer the Seattle and Detroit to Norfolk, Va., or another home port. The 30-year-old ships are to be decommissioned in three to five years.
