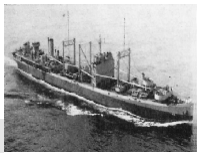

Naval History – Highlight of Reunion



History will be the main attraction of this year's reunion in Charleston, S.C, and in particular Naval history. Our Friday trip to Patriot's Point Naval and Maritime Museum for the Association wreath laying ceremony will also include stops at WW2, and Vietnam eras of the Navy's historical timeline. For those who have not visited the Museum, it is an opportunity to view hardware, from a number of branches of the Navy, spanning several decades of service.

The USS Yorktown (CV-10) will serve as the site of our wreath laying. We have also made arrangements to have lunch aboard Yorktown in the CPO mess (see activity sheet).



After lunch, those of our group who wish, may travel back in time to the beginning of the Civil War with a visit to Ft. Sumter.



Saturday's tour choices will include a guided tour of

historical Charleston with a stop at the famed Battery and Market area for shopping and lunch (lunch is not part of the tour cost).

The other tour choice is a combination of the historical Charleston city tour and a visit to Boone Hall and Charles Pinckney Plantations.

Both of these tours will be made in the comfort of air conditioned vans.
