This would be advantageous for both parties, as it will reduce the cost per person for the cabin.

Here is the final information on the 2005 cruise to the Bahamas. Most of it has been published before, so this is a final reminder.

For those having contacted JetSet Cruise and are arriving in Miami early for the cruise, rooms have been secured at the Holiday Inn at 340 Biscayne Boulevard, Miami FL 33132 for the dates you have specified. The rate will be \$85.00 + tax per room. If you need a rollaway, they charge \$10.00. The hotel has limited parking at \$10.00 per day.

The rooms secured for early arrivals, for the most part, are non-smoking rooms unless you have specified otherwise. If you have any questions about your accommodations at the Holiday Inn, please contact JetSet Cruise as soon as possible. Also, let them know if there are special circumstances that the hotel should be aware of. This "Nitro" rate will good for those wishing to arrive even earlier or stay after the cruise.

Shuttle transport, from the hotel to the ship on Friday, June 24th, has also been obtained. The cost is \$5.00 per person. If you have not yet talked with either Mark or Cathy at JetSet about the shuttle, you need to do so as soon as possible. Contact them at JetSet Cruise (toll free 866-201-2752 or 763-479-6477).

Nitro Association members, guests and family members will be seated for meals as a group. If you would like to be seated at the same table with someone else attending the reunion, or as a family, please contact Mark Sikes or Cathy so arrangements can be made for seating assignments. If no seating arrangements are made, feel free to sit anywhere within our group's dining area

The cruise line has parking available at the pier. The rates are \$12 per day or \$20 per day for oversize vehicles. No reservation is required for parking at either the hotel or the cruise line parking lot.



Reunion Meetings

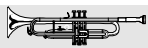
Nitro returns to Las Vegas in 2006

Navy Times articles



Here are some excerpts from the past few issues. *The Navy Times*:

(1) X USS Oriskany to be sunk in Gulf of Mexico as part of the reef program for naval vessels. (Some of you might remember the Nitro and Oriskany had a run-in of the coast of Vietnam).

(2) Since the 9/11 terrorist attacks, nearly 1 million service members have taken part in the missions in and around Iraq and Afghanistan.

(3) Navy to reduce forces by as many as 20,000 over the next two years by means of tougher re-ups, early outs and lower recruiting goals. The Navy looks for 95% of their future recruits to have high school or better education.

"Continuing Service to the Fleet"

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(4) Due to the nature of changing threats worldwide, Navy of the future most likely to comprise fewer large ships (cruisers, destroyers) and more armed smaller craft and unmanned vehicles.

(5) Possible budget cuts could affect every component of the Navy through 2011. One less Virginia-class SSN, capping of LPD 17 class amphibious ships at nine, deleting of twenty-two Osprey V-22 aircraft and cutting of twenty KC-130J aircraft are some of the proposed areas of budget cuts.

(6) Controversial 360° evals being considered by Navy. This would allow evals of personnel by subordinates, peers and superior officers.

(7) Over 13,000 military personnel and 17 U. S. Navy ships were involved in tsunami relief efforts in SW Asia.

(8) Navy submarine, USS San Francisco, slams into Pacific underwater mountain southeast of Guam, which resulted in one death and many injuries among crew. Incident may have been due to inaccurate charts of area.

(9) Recovering economy could be one factor that hinders military recruiting efforts.

(10) FL lawmakers vow to fight Navy proposal to mothball the carrier John F. Kennedy, homeported in Mayport.

(11) CNO, ADM Verne Clarke, to retire. ADM Michael Mullen likely to become new CNO.

(12) Army continues to go after Navy enlisted and officers, who may be eligible to be separated from the Naval service, with bonuses up to \$20,000.

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2005 Association Dues are \$23.95 (including S/H of Assn. Packet). The dues packet will include a "60 Years Service to the Fleet" patch as well as two Association license plate frames, quarterly newsletters, membership certificate (for **new** members only), crewmembers directory and a laminated membership card.

There are also Associated Membership dues available for spouses of former or deceased USS Nitro (AE-2/AE-23) crew members, children of former or deceased crew members or for any former U. S. Navy personnel having an interest in or desire to join the USS Nitro Association. This classification would allow those members to receive a membership certificate & card and 4 quarterly newsletters each year (***dues premiums and crewmember directory will not be included in this classification.***) The cost of the Associate Membership will be \$14.00 (\$12.50 dues + \$1.50 S/H) per calendar year.
